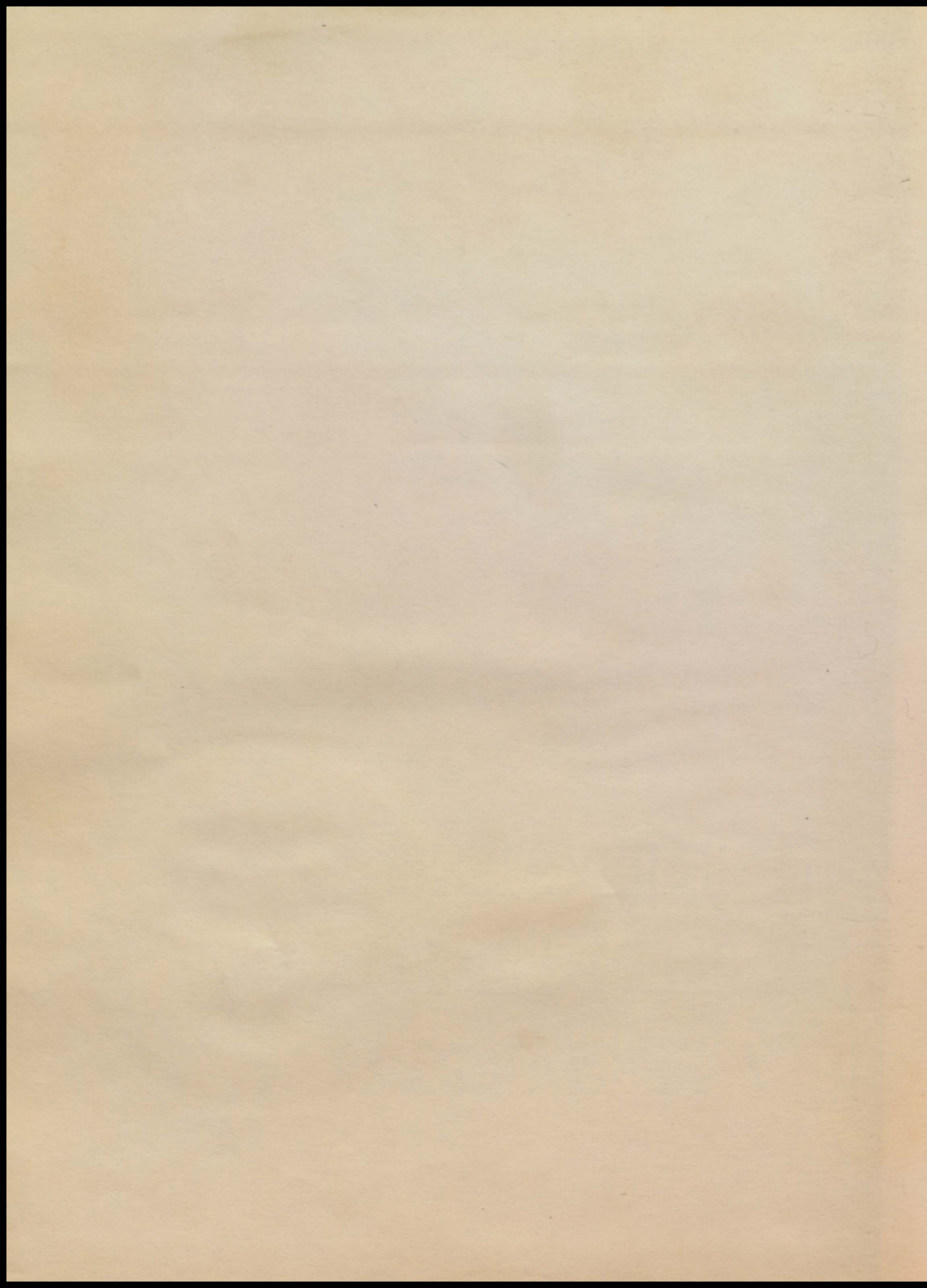




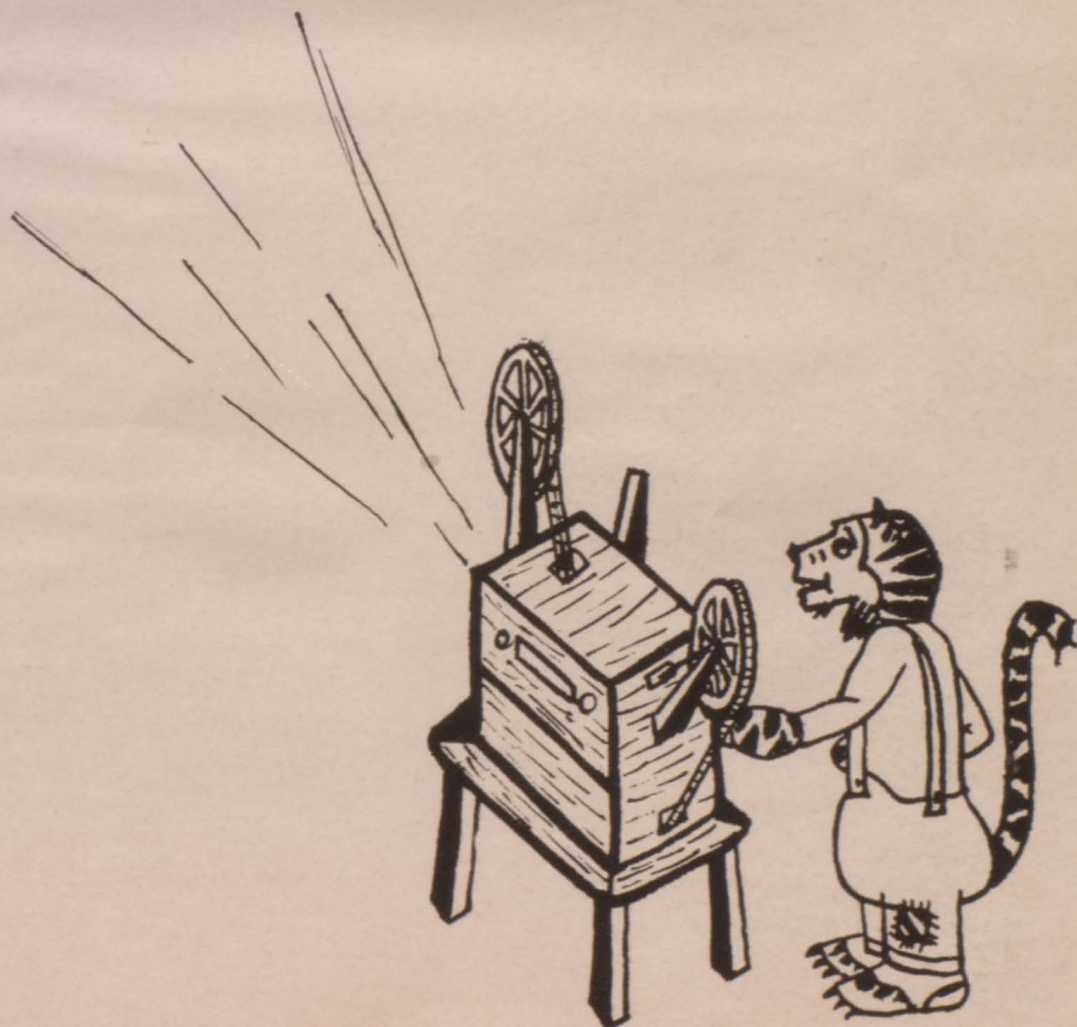
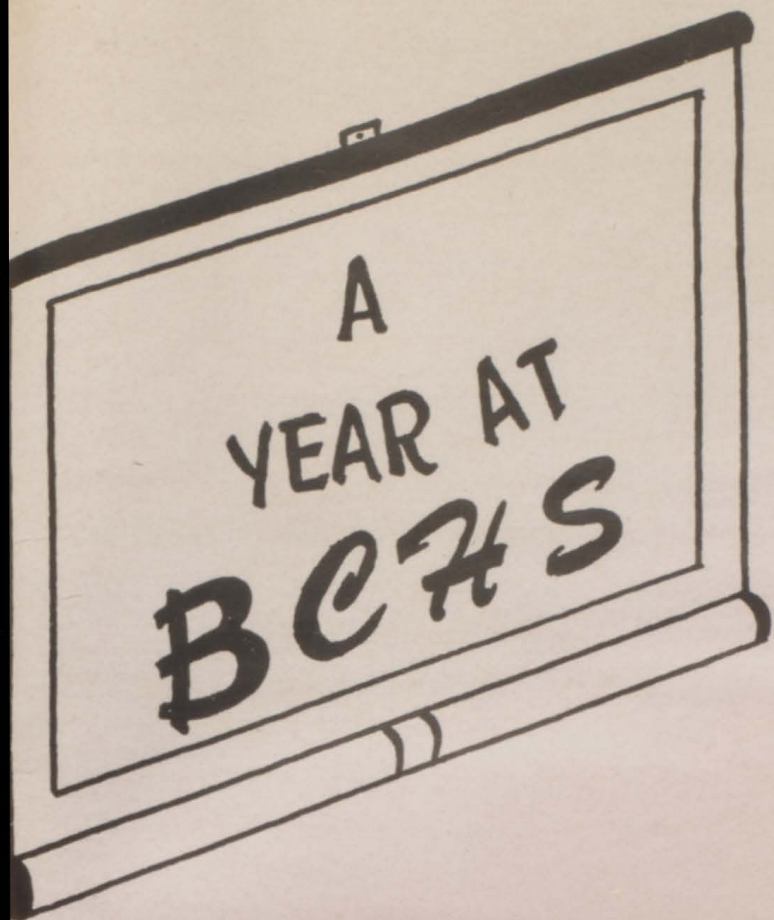

All these days and nights that went together—all this was “A Year at Baldwin County High School.”

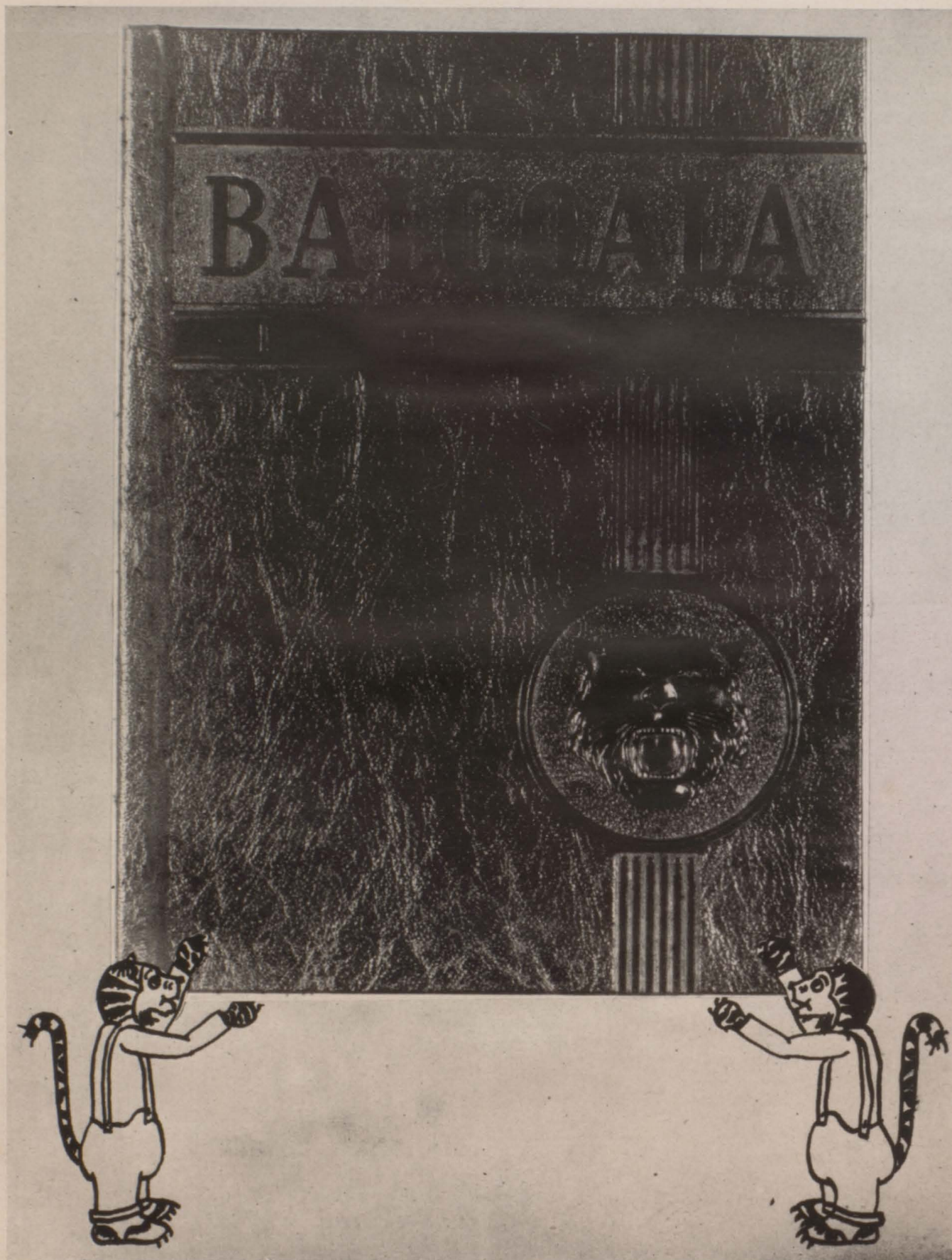

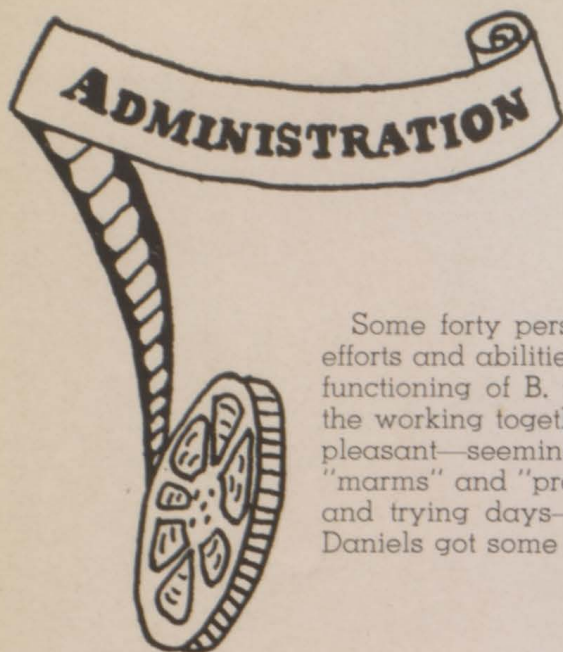




# BRIGHTER SIDE *of* LIFE

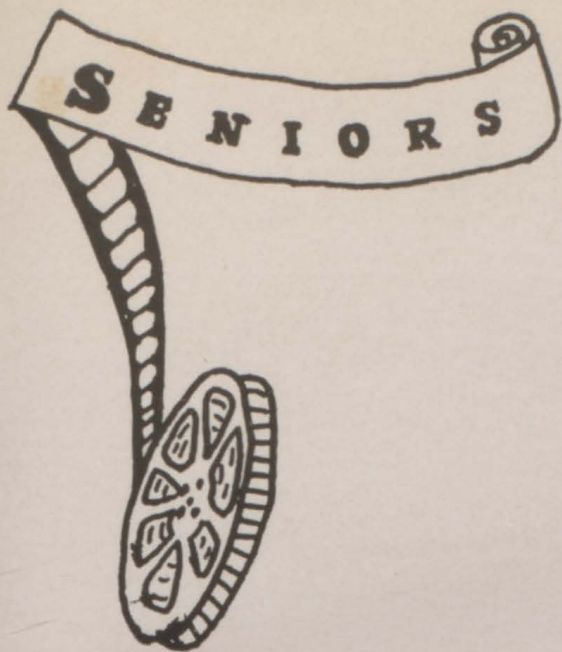

Later in the year we are going to contribute to the Stack Room.



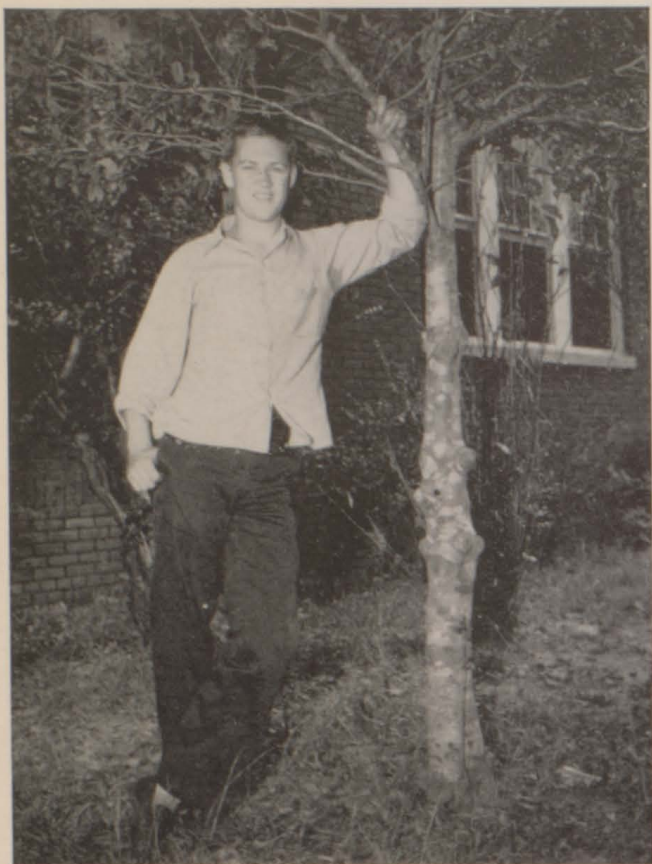
