Our teachers, both in grammar and high school, have meant a lot to us and we shall never forget them.

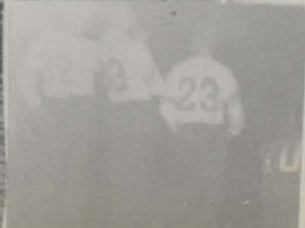
LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT

Claire Brame and Diane Owen were majorettes for the band, Helen Wurst, Johnny Gibson received pins for being outstanding members.

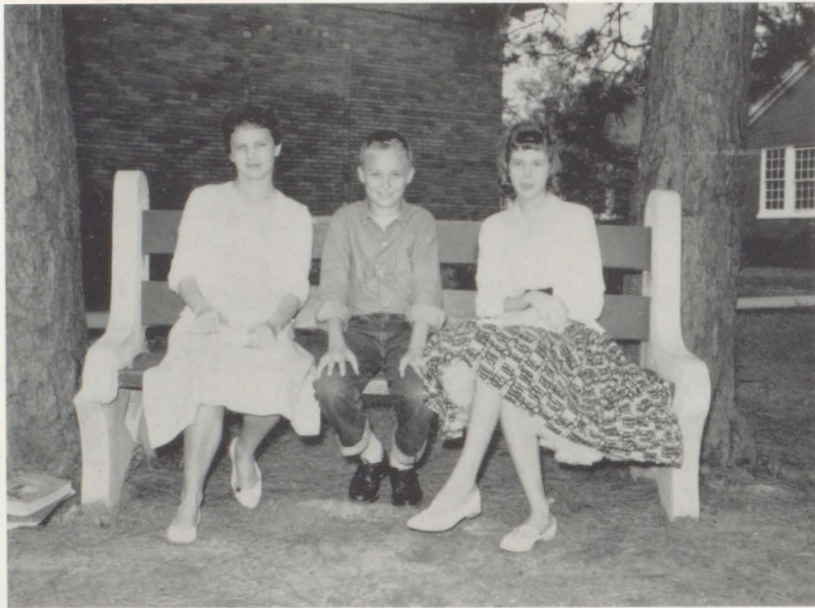
Our class party was held at Little River State Park.

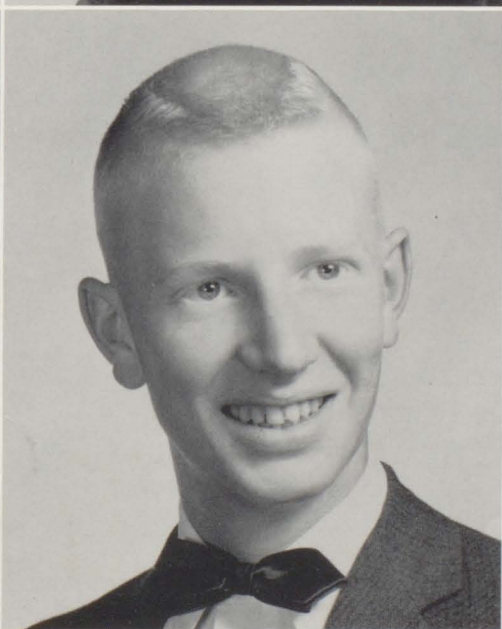
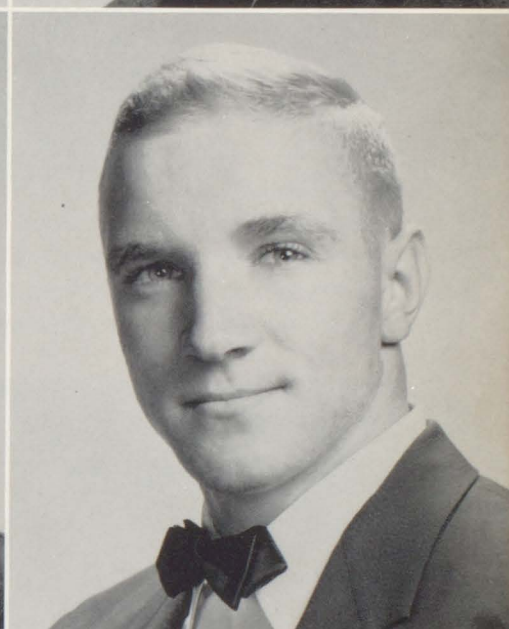
Sophomore Hop
