Mary Montgomery walked onto Simmons field with heads high in expectation only to walk off with heads hung in defeat.

Fairhope had a funeral procession for the Mighty Tigers, only to be buried themselves 21-6.

Vigor fell victim to the Tiger's fireball by a rollover score of 35-0.

Murphy's hopes were shattered when the Tigers made them victim number five of the year.

Williamson of Mobile was pulled under the Tiger title wave 27-6.

Shaw had one more chance for a play-off spot in Alabama 4-A category. The Tigers tuffed it over Shaw 19-0.

Foley was turned back 14-0 in the latter part of the season, but Satsuma was next. After the dust cleared at Gator Stadium, shouts of "We're Number 1" told who won. Satsuma was peeled 42-11.

Atmore was last on the Tigers busy schedule, and they also fell victim to the "Big Orange Machine," 35-7.

The Tigers reached play-off day with a perfect 10-0 season. Surly West-End was next but it was the Tigers turn to taste defeat as West-End went back to Birmingham with an 18-7 victory.



Volleyball Team Is No. 1 in County















A Night to Remember












Projects Keep F.H.A. Involved and Busy






Fashion Flings
