


The dancing and the singing and the late night rehearsals sort of turned us into an extended family. We loved the "colorful" set and felt the energy; we" put on a play."






Each class worked with an artist from Herff Jones to produce a "mark" that would be uniquely theirs. They seem to have captured the mood.

Twenty individuals worked in the weight rooms all summer to better themselves which in turn made a better team. These people made up a group called **The Winners Club.**














There it is





The club participated in the Regional Science Olympiad held during Spring Break and brought home five medals.


Future Farmers of America





All of these provided a basic background for students to meet the real world. -Burt Beck



The Varsity Band proved they were a step above the rest. They were superior. -Cathy Hicks & Diana Watts






Whether it was the military, college, or simple relaxation, each senior had his own dream for the future.
