










In class, freshmen became accustomed to the block schedule. Who could imagine SITTING STILL for 96 minutes at a time???

Homecoming was an exciting time for these freshmen as they constructed their first homecoming float for the parade. They learned at this time that being organized was the most important float-building aspect.


